TOURNAMENT STRUCTURE:

1. Top seeded team will be the “home team” and bat last throughout the tournament.
2. Umpires will be assigned by the Section IX Baseball Committee, in conjunction with the league assignors, based on coach’s ratings.
3. The home team or “host team” will be responsible for charging admission: \$3.00 for adults and \$2.00 for students. All proceeds (regional) must be delivered to the chairman.
4. The home team or “host school” will be responsible for preparing the field.
5. The home team or “host school” will be responsible for notifying the chairman and opposing school or schools for any postponement due to inclement weather.
6. Each team must furnish for (4) new baseballs for each game. Other new baseballs should be made available by each team, if needed. The sectional baseball is the Rawlings R100. By state contract, the regional and state tournament baseball is the Rawlings R100.
7. The winning team and coach *must* notify the press of the game results. He must also notify the Chairman at his home of the results following each game.
8. In regional play, the home section is the home team.
9. The tournament entry blank and point system card must be received by the league Chairman prior to the Thursday, May 20thrd seeding meeting. The head coach must telephone the chairman with results of games played after the submission of the card.
10. Prior to the sectional finals, each home school will pay for the umpires, as well as all expenses incurred with hosting the game. Two umpires will be used for all preliminary games. Three umpires will be used for sectional finals and regional games. Section IX will pay for expenses incurred at sectional final sites.
11. Awards: Eighteen (18) shields per champion team (Section IX approved). First and second place plaques to competing school in each classification.
12. The rules will be those of the National Federation of State High School Association. Local rules, which differ, will not be allowed. (Sectionals, regionals and state tournament).
13. Tournament protests:
 - A. The coach must notify the Umpire-in-Chief (plate) that the game is under protest. Both must sign the scorebook at the point of protest.
 - B. If the protest cannot be settled on the field, a written report must be submitted by the coach and the Umpire-in-Chief to the Section IX Baseball Committee. The final decision will be made by the committee with advise from our state rules interpreter.
 - C. No protest based on umpire’s judgement will be heard by the committee.
14. A team will not be permitted to participate in regional or state tournament games unless a signed code of conduct form for each player is presented to the contest site supervisor prior to competition.
15. It is expected that good sportsmanship will be in evidence by all players, coaches, parents and spectators at all times.

NYSPHAA – Baseball Pitching Rule:

A pitcher may pitch in a maximum of twelve (12) innings in one (1) day, but no more than eighteen (18) innings any six (6) consecutive day period. Delivery of one (1) pitch constitutes having pitched an inning. If he pitches in eight (8) or more innings in a day, he must have two (2) or more nights rest before he can pitch again. Any violation of the rule will be considered in the same light as a school using an ineligible player. The game will be forfeited.

Team Selection:

1. .500 or better division record
2. .500 or better in “class” competition
3. .500 or better in “class” within division
4. .500 or better overall
5. plus points overall
6. plus points in division
7. committee selection

Seeding and Tournament Qualifications:

It is imperative that all teams complete their league schedule by Thursday, May 20, 2010

If a team fails to complete their league schedule, their entry and seed will be determined by the Section IX Baseball Committee.

Seeding:

By committee, using the Section IX criteria, i.e. division points divided by the number of division games. Tie breaker will be: 1) head to head, 2) overall total points divided by overall games.

Point system cards must be received by the league chairman prior to the Thursday, May 20^h, seeding meeting for entry into the tournament.

SEEDING MODIFICATION WORKSHEET INSTRUCTIONS

There are two situations where the modification could apply:

1. Type 1 - A larger school with more than 50% of their division games against smaller schools.
2. Type 2 - A smaller school with more than 50% of their division games against larger schools.

During the 2010 baseball season there are seven schools that could potentially be affected by the modification:

- FDR - AA in division with all A schools (Type 1)
- Red Hook - A in division with 67% of division games vs B (Type 1)
- New Paltz - A in division with 67% of division games vs B (Type 1)
- Marlboro - B in division with 67% of division games vs A (Type 2)
- Highland - B in division with 67% of division games vs A (Type 2)
- Pine Plains - C in division with all B schools (Type 2)
- John A Coleman - D in division with all C schools (Type2)

For each of these schools determine:

- a) Total number of games played
- b) Total number of non-league games played
- c) Number of games against opponents of the same class
- d) Number of non-league games against opponents of the same class

For Type 1 determine if they meet either of the criteria:

- Is the number of games against opponents of the same class divided by total number of games played $> 25\%$?
- Is the number of non-league games against opponents of the same class divided by total number of non-league games played $> 50\%$?
- If yes, these games are included in determining the see
- If no, the team cannot be seeded higher than 5th.

For Type 2 only include the non-league games if they improve their points/games number.
