### 2. REMINDERS OF LAWS AND REGULATIONS:

- Schools <u>must</u> provide students with the requirements in Education Law and Commissioner's Regulation. Physical education <u>is required by Education Law 803</u> (Required Instruction in Physical Education) as per Commissioner's Regulation 135.4.
- There <u>must</u> be continuous evaluation of the instructional program and assessment of individual pupil needs and progress as per CR 135.4.
- Director of Physical Education position is required as per CR 135.4
  - <u>must</u> have certification in physical education and administrative and supervisory service.
  - <u>must</u> provide leadership and supervision for the class instruction, intramural activities, and interschool athletic competition in the total physical education program.
  - Where there are <u>extenuating circumstances</u>, a member of the physical education staff <u>may</u> be designated for such responsibilities, upon approval of the commissioner. School districts <u>may</u> share the services of a director of physical education.
- As per CR 135.4 c (iii) there <u>must</u> be opportunity provided for participation in appropriate extra-class activities.
- **Health Education** is required as per Commissioner's Regulation 135.3

### **COMBINING OF TEAMS**

### Presenter:

Robert Zayas, NYSPHSAA Executive director

### Proposal:

Consider revising the NYSPHSAA Handbook (page 95) to read:

COMBINING OF TEAMS - The joining together of students from two or more member schools in the same district or close proximity to form a single team shall be permitted subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Permission must be obtained from their league and section on an annual basis.
- 2. Section approval must be reported to the NYSPHSAA, Inc. Executive Committee. NOTE: If a combined school team goes beyond sectional level competition their boys and girls grades 9-11 enrollment shall be combined, *using the below criteria*, for state level competition.
  - a. The school(s) with the higher(est) classification number will have a percentage of the other school(s) classification number added according to the graduated scale below. The percentage is dependent upon the association's "5 sport classification cut off numbers,"

Class AA = 50% Class A = 40% Class B = 30% Class C = 30% Class D = 20%

- 3. Section shall determine the deadlines for schools to merge or demerge programs
- 4. If a nonpublic school is part of the merger, the "merged" team may be subject to the Section's Classification of Non-Public Schools Committee

Reporting Procedure: All violations shall be reported to the League and Section.

### Rationale:

The rationale for the graduated scale is being proposed to better ensure the smallest schools in the state can afford their students with participation opportunities because the receiving school's classification cut off numbers have "less" of chance of being negatively impacted. Currently Class C and D schools have a difficult time merging in some cases, because of the negative impact or "perceived" negative impact, upon the classification cut off numbers.

### Proposal Originated:

At the 2012 summer Central Committee meeting, a motion to approve the Chief of School Officers recommendation to create a committee to thoroughly review the issue of combining of teams as it effects classification with an emphasis on creating opportunities for students and to have a preliminary report by December 2012 carried.

The committee was charged with reviewing the issues relative to economics, declining enrollment, emerging teams and declining participation.

### **Budget Impact:**

The budgetary impact may vary based upon the program, the number of athletes participating and the distance of travel for the merged programs.

The Combining of Teams Ad Hoc committee had all 11 sections represented and met on November 19, December 12 and December 21 via teleconference.
