The NYSPHSAA constitution:

ARTICLE VI

League and Section Organization

1. A school may join with other schools to form a league for the purpose of providing interschool athletic competition among schools of comparable size, similar interests, and within reasonable distance of each other. Leagues so formed shall be organized and affairs conducted in accordance with the rules of the section and of the association. If the section athletic council is unable to provide for league affiliation, they shall refer the problem to the NYSHSAA, Inc. Executive Committee within 30 days for action.

- 3. The contest shall be developed with due regard for health and safety standards as set forth by the NYS Commissioner of Education Regulations, and policies and standards of the NYSPHSAA, Inc.
- 4. Insurance shall be provided which will protect the participants in case of injury and the organization or institution against liability.
- 5. The philosophy and standards which are to be followed shall be consistent with those listed in the most current NYSPHSAA, Inc. HANDBOOK.
- 6. Financial arrangements are to be clearly specified in the application for approval.

Action Item Action Item Discussion/ Information Item
Presenter: Greg Ransom
Proposal: To allow Section IX to play 8 man football with an alternate field dimension from NFHS rules. The field length would remain at 100 yards with 10 yard end zones but the width would be 40 yards.
Effective Start Date: September 2018
Rationale: Section IX has 7 to 8 schools who are having significant number issues. 8 man football offers an opportunity to keep their programs alive. Based on the skill level of the schools a narrow field will help keep games from being dominated by one exceptional athlete and schools would not have to move goal posts. NFHS rules allow 8 man football field dimensions to be altered with state association approval.
