<u>Handbook Committee</u> – Eligibility of non-corresponding transfer students

Action Item Discussion Item Informational Item
Presenter: Pat Pizzarelli, Handbook Committee Chair
Proposal: Consider approval of no longer differentiating between 7-10 grade students and 11-12 grade students when determining the eligibility of non-corresponding transfer students.
Effective Start Date: ASAP
Rationale: To allow member schools to enforce and interpret the NYSPHSAA Transfer Rule more easily. Leagues and/or Sections continue to have the ability to limit participation of 11 th and 12 th graders on sub-varsit teams. Nowhere else in the NYSPHSAA Handbook are grade levels differentiated.

FOOTBALL - ESTABLISH AN 8-MAN REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Propos	al:

The NYSPHSAA Football Committee is seeking approval to establish a Regional Football Championship for 8-man for a two-year period. The following regulations would be followed by all participating teams:

- 1. Only Class C and D football teams would be permitted to compete in the 8-man post season. (only schools with enrollment numbers of 396 and below {current Class C cut-off} would be eligible to compete in fall 2022)
- 2. The field size for post season play would be a regulation 11-man football field

Effective Start Date:

Fall 2022

Rationale:

Currently, there are 7 Sections (Section 1, 6, and 10 each have 1 team) that compete in 8-man football for a total of 41 schools. Sections 3, 4, 5 (plus 1 from Section 6), and Section 9 (plus 1 from Section 1) have Sectional Championships. Sections 3 and 5 as well as Sections 4 and 9 have held regional games the past two years. This proposal would bring these winners together to play for a NYSPHSAA Regional Championship. The NYSPHSAA Regional Championship would be held at the location of the West 11-man Football Semifinal (pending approval of the site). There would be 3 games on Friday and 3 games on Saturday.

Budgetary Impact:

Since Sections 3,4,5, and 9 already hold sub-regional games they would continue to take on all expenses and revenues associated with those games. Expenses and revenues associated with the Regional Final will be incorporated into the NYSPHSAA State Semifinal budget with the 11-man football games thus NYSPHSAA will be responsible for this game.

FOOTBALL – Change in Targeting Disqualification Penalty

Action Item Discussion Item Informational Item
Presenter: Gary Vanderzee, NYSPHSAA Football State Coordinator
Proposal: The NYSPHSAA Football Committee is seeking approval for a change in the penalty for a football player who is disqualified for "targeting" (by a certified official) to not being permitted to participate in the next two full halves.
Effective Start Date: Fall 2022
Rationale: The NFHS rule states that a player flagged for a "targeting" play is to be disqualified from that game. The NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship rule states that a player disqualified from a contest must sit out the next scheduled contest. In the NCAA and the NFL, a targeting penalty is reviewed in slow motion and a final determination is made if it is in fact a targeting call. The NFHS does not allow video replay for officials and calls are being made in a split second by officials. The football committee understands that officials do a great job but sometimes make mistakes and they support the NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship Rule. The sport of football has approximately 50% less contests than other sports which means a player serving the penalty under the Sportsmanship Rule is much more effected than student-athletes in other sports. The committee feels that if a student serves their suspension for two full halves it has less impact but also meets the intent of the NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship Rule.

Notes:

The football committee voted unanimously in favor of this proposal at its January 3rd meeting. This recommendation is a revised recommendation from the committee. The revisions specify the disqualification penalty of targeting only and that a student is ineligible for two full halves instead of four quarters. Therefore, if a student was disqualified for targeting in the first half they would be ineligible for the rest of that game and the first half of the next game. If the player is disqualified for targeting in the second half of a game, they would be ineligible for the rest of that game and the entire next game.

<u>GIRLS VOLLEYBALL</u> – REMOVE WAIVER FOR 5th SET; PLAY TO 15 POINTS AT VARSITY LEVEL ONLY

Rationale: This is for the varsity level only. The committee feels due to a struggle with players and distributing playing time at the modified and JV levels, playing to 25 points is better suited for those levels. Many modified and JV programs already play three sets as it is.

GIRLS VOLLEYBALL – WAIVE NYSPHSAA WARM UP RULE #3; ADOPT NCAA WARM UP RULE

Proposal: The NYSPHSAA Girls Volleyball Committee is seeking to waive NYSPHSAA Rule #3 which does not allow any warmups behind or adjacent to the playing court (May 2005). The committee would like to adopt the NCAA warmup rule which allows teams to warmup behind or adjacent to the competition court if there is 6'6" of space around the border of the warmup area.
Effective: September 1, 2022
Rationale: Adopting the NCAA rule will allow teams to take part in short or small group warmup activities behind or adjacent to the competition court while the other team is warming up on the court. The current rule was adopted nearly 17 years ago which forces one team to always be waiting its turn for full court warm ups.

GIRLS & BOYS TENNIS — ESTABLISH 9th/10th PLACE PLAYBACK FORMAT AT BOTH INDIVIDUAL STATE TOURNAMENTS

Action Item Discussion Item Informational Item
Presenter: Chris Horgan, NYSPHSAA Girls Tennis State Coordinator Selina DeCicco, NYSPHSAA Boys Tennis State Coordinator
Proposal: The NYSPHSAA Girls and Boys Tennis Committees are seeking approval to establish a format to play for 9^{th} and 10^{th} place in singles and doubles at both individual state tournaments.
Effective: June 1, 2022
Rationale: This would allow the bottom 24 players from the losers bracket of the first and second rounds to get the opportunity to play for 9 th and 10 th place medals. Only the players who advance to the main draw quarterfinals will play for 1 st through 8 th places. This concept is similar to wrestling individual championships where athletes can wrestleback to 3 rd place. All matches would be best two out of three sets with AD scoring.
This proposal will yield an additional 24 matches on day #1 of each tournament 12 matches on day #2 and 2 matches on day #3.

Budgetary Impact: NYSPHSAA would incur the cost of adding medals for 9 th and 10 th place

FIELD HOCKEY – AMEND CURRENT REGIONAL ROTATION TO INCLUDE AT LARGE BERTH TO FILL BYES

Presenter: Bev Hooper, NYSPHSAA Field Hockey Coordinator
Proposal: The NYSPHSAA Field Hockey Committee is seeking approval to amend its current regional rotation/assignments for 2022-2025 and include at-large berths to fill the byes.
Effective: June 1, 2022
Rationale: The current regional rotation has been an equitable rotation in the first five of nine years, however . Section 5 will not have a Class C school starting in fall 2022. This leaves Section 6, Class C team without regional opponent based on the current rotation. To avoid a team winning Sectionals and getting a bye directly to the State Final Four, the committee would like to use an at-large team from another section to complete the regional rotation. This maintains the current rotation and also allows sections who may have contracts with site for 2022 Regional play to keep them.
The at-large berths would be necessary in three of the final four years of the current regional rotation. The current regional rotation plays an out-bracket game due to having an odd number of regions participating. On those years where Section 5 is involved there will not be an adjustment. Travel was discussed but the number of schools with field hockey in each section was the final determining factor. This at-large concept for field hockey mirrors football and ice hockey.

Budgetary Impact: Expenses will be incurred by the at-large berth traveling in Regional and State Tournament play
