### **Modified Committee** – Increasing Max Number of Events for Track and Field

<b>Proposal:</b> The NYSPHSAA Modified Committee is recommending increasing the maximum number of events for a track athlete from 3 to 4 providing one of the 4 is a relay. The are also recommending eliminating the distance restrictions in the modified Track and Field regulation.

Rationale: This change would allow for more participation for our modified athletes. Many schools were struggling to fill relay teams because of the restriction of 3 events. The committee also feels the restriction to the distance run by the modified athletes is not needed and coaches should be able to put students in events they feel are appropriate.

#### **Proposal**

The NYSPHSAA Football Committee is seeking approval of an amendment to the Combined Practice guidelines for 11-man football.

#### **Effective Start Date**

August 19, 2023

#### Rationale

In 2019 the NYSPHSAA Football State Committee established guidelines for interschool practices. Five items make up the framework of these guidelines. Items d) and e) are being proposed to be revised.

#### **CURRENT GUIDELINES:**

- a) Coaches are to instruct their own players.
- b) "Full Live" contact is permitted but not required.
- c) Athletes/Teams may not participate in a combined practice unless they previously completed five (5) days of practice.
- d) While working on team situational aspects, drills may not exceed seven (7) players from either team. This will allow for teams to conduct a 7 v 7 period for skill positions or it may be designed to focus on an inside run package to emphasize offensive/defensive line play.
- e) Schools using more than seven (7) players in a team drill will be in violation of this rule.

#### PROPOSED CHANGES:

- d) While working on team situational aspects, drills may not exceed a maximum of nine (9) players from either team. This will allow for teams to conduct a 9 v 9 period for skill positions or it may be designed to focus on an inside run package to emphasize offensive/defensive line play.
- \*\* 8-Man Football teams will only be allowed a maximum of seven (7) players from either team.
- e) 11-Man teams using more than nine (9) players in a team drill will be in violation of this rule. 8-Man teams using more than seven (7) players in a team drill will be in violation of this rule.

The rationale for the request centers on allowing teams to work on inside run play with a full line. Currently, with the 7 v7 rule in place, a team that uses a tight end with two running backs can't run full line drills. They would need to use 5 linemen plus the tight end and quarterback and they are already at the maximum of 7 without counting the running backs. As a result, teams are forced to go half line and not incorporate any backside linemen. Most teams utilize pulling lineman from the back side when

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executing inside run play. If the rule is modified to read a maximum of 9 players, teams could use 5 linemen, a tight end, and 2 running backs to get a true evaluation and a more productive drill.

When the state committee established these guidelines, the 7 v 7 rule was put in for two reasons:

- 1. There needed to be a clear distinction that these drills were not actually scrimmages with 11 on 11 so the decision was made to max out at 7 v 7 so it would be clear to all, it was not an 11 on 11 full team scrimmage. We believe modifying this rule will still accomplishes that same premise while allowing for a more productive teaching period for athletes. Anyone viewing this period will still note the offense has no wide receivers and the defense has no defensive backs. It will still be evident to all that this is not an 11 on 11 situation.
- 2. If more than 7 v 7 was permitted, 8-Man teams would have a full line-up thus making it a scrimmage. With that, we would only be asking for this modification be implemented for 11-Man football.

It should also be noted the original decision to max at 7 v 7 had nothing to do with safety. As mentioned, it was simply put in so there was a distinction between the combined practice and a scrimmage. This change would still honor that premise.

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### Boys Wrestling - NFHS 1.5 % Weight Loss Plan

The NYSPHSAA Boys Wrestling Committee is recommending following the NFHS 1.5% weight loss plan.
The NTS TISAA boys Wrestling committee is recommending following the NTTS 1.5% weight loss plant
Effective Start Date:

Rationale:
Currently wrestlers are certified to a minimum wrestling weight and must weigh in 50% of their matche
at the weight in which they want to compete in the post season. The 1.5% weight loss plan sets up a
weight loss plan for the wrestler in which they can only lose 1.5% of their body weight each week. The
plan can be given to the wrestler at the beginning of the season so they can know exactly what the
minimum weight they can weigh in each week. If the student weighs in more than the minimum weigh
for the week the plan is recalculated. The wrestler and the coach can monitor the plan each week during the season. The 1.5% weight loss plan would replace the 50% rule.

<b>Proposal:</b> The NYSPHSAA Boys Wrestling Committee is recommending eliminating the NYSPHSAA honor weigh-in.
The NTSPHSAA boys Wiestling Committee is recommending eminimating the NTSPHSAA honor weigh-in.

Rationale:
Currently teams are allowed to weigh-in in the morning of a match and if the students make the weight
for a particular weight class, they are given a 3lb allowance for the mat side weigh-in during the evening
match. The honor weigh-ins are required to be monitored by a school administrator or their designee.
There are doubts in most Sections that an administrator is monitoring the honor weigh-ins. If the 1.5%
weight loss plan is approved, the practice of honor weigh-ins would allow students to keep fluctuating
during the season which is not in the best interest of the student.

<b>Proposal:</b> The NYSPHSAA Boys Wrestling Committee is recommending using the following NFHS weight classes plus a NYSPHSAA lower weight. The weight classes would be 101 (NYSPHSAA), 108, 116, 124, 131, 138, 145, 152, 160, 170, 190, 215, 285.
Effective Start Date: 2023-2024 season
Rationale: The NFHS has given the State Associations the option to select 12, 13, or 14 weight classes. The committee feels that the NFHS 12 weight classes is best suited for NYS. The committee also feels that NYS has had a lower weight class for many decades and many Sections would like to keep a lower weight class.

Rationale: The new format to determine the classification cut-off numbers for non-variation sports in two division sports is 40% of the teams in Division 1 and 60% of the teams in Division 2. The Boys Wrestling Committee is concerned with the imbalance of the two Divisions. The Boys Wrestling Committee would like to keep the divisions balanced and the cut-off numbers being 600 and above for Division 1 and 599 and below being Division 2.

<b>Proposal:</b> The NYSPHSAA Staff and Girls Flag Football Committee is seeking to conduct a state championship starting in spring 2024.
Effective Start Date: Week #48 in Spring 2024
Rationale:  Due to Girls Flag Football meeting the criteria of six sections with four or more programs, a state championship may be established per the NYSPHSAA Championship Philosophy.

#### Proposal Originated:

The NYSPHSAA Girls Flag Football Committee met for the first time on September 14, 2022.

### **Budget Impact:**

There will be travel expenses for schools to send a flag football team to a state championship in addition to NYSPHSAA incurring expenses to rent a venue, pay for officials and awards, travel, and also pay for other associated state tournament expenses. Additionally, schools/sections/NYSPHSAA will generate revenue from admissions at local games, Section tournaments and the State Tournament to help offset budgets.

#### Other

Each section will send a representative to a Regional competition (see proposed regions below) for the right to advance to the State Semifinals/Finals. Teams will be made up of 15-30 players and follow the NFHS Football Rules supplemented by the NYSPHSAA Flag Football rules. They will also adopt all high school sports standards as published in the NYSPHSAA handbook.

The schedule is proposed as follows:

State Semifinals/Finals

Week #48 – Games on Fri & Sat OR Sat & Sun

Regionals

Week #47 – Games on Friday, Saturday or Sunday

Section Tournament

Week #46 – Games days to be determined by the section

Proposed Regions:

North Sections: II, III, VII, X

South Sections: VIII, XI

West Sections: V, VI

East Sections: I, IV, IX

\*tentative; subject to change



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#### Venues:

Section Tournaments and Regional game sites will be determined by sections. Regional rotations will be set up by the committee and approved by CAC and Executive Committee. The State Semifinals/Finals will be determined by a bid process at least one year prior to the event date, approved by the Executive Committee.

#### Awards:

Certificates for Regionals, Semi-Finalists and Finals will be distributed. Championship t-shirts, 1st place medals, plaques, Final Four bracket boards and champion boards will be awarded to team champions. Finalists will be awarded medals and plaques. Semi-finalists will receive plaques. Sportsmanship shirts will be awarded to one athlete from each participating State Tournament team. A maximum number of team personnel will be established to allow for a budgeted quantities of awards.

### Staff/Officials:

NYSPHSAA Staff will oversee and manage the planning of this event with consultation with the state coordinator and committee. The state coordinator shall oversee gameday operations on the field with assistance from NYSPHSAA and the state committee.

Game officials will be determined using Officials Fees & Policies procedures, established by CAC, and will be similar to girls lacrosse procedures.
