


NEW YORK STATE TICKET TRANSPARENCY LAW

Details:
New York State passed a law this summer that applies to electronic tickets for any events held in New York. The law requires sellers to show the total cost of the ticket prior to being selected for purchase, inclusive of all fees. Fee disclosure cannot be misleading or presented in a manner that may misrepresent the final cost to the purchaser (e.g. larger font, bold type, etc). Sellers cannot increase the price at any point in the purchasing process except the addition of a delivery fee if a non-electronic delivery method is selected. Electronic delivery of tickets must be free. Penalties include a fine ranging from \$250-\$500 at state's discretion. The law also permits individuals that suffer a violation to bring private action and to recover actual damages or \$50, whichever is greater, plus attorney fees.
NYSPHSAA Membership Impact: The law is primarily targeted at large resellers and distributors (e.g. Ticketmaster, StubHub) but it applie to GoFan and any other digital ticket seller as well. GoFan is currently in the process of re-tooling their purchase process to be in compliance, but it will likely not be ready in time for fall events. Traditionally, our tickets sold online pass the fee along to the purchaser. Until the GoFan update is complete, we will be including the fee in our ticket price and absorbing the fee ourselves.
Example: Tickets to a NYSPHSAA championship event are \$10 plus \$1.50 fee from GoFan. Tickets will now be listed as \$11.50 and GoFan will retain the \$1.50 before transferring the proceeds to NYSPHSAA. Messaging will be added to the NYSPHSAA ticketing page to explain the change in the displayed price from last year so purchasers understand NYSPHSAA has not raised ticket prices.



Status Updates:

1. Pat welcomed the committee and handed it over to Dr. Zayas. Central Committee defeated "Consider approval of no longer differentiating between 7-10 grade students and 11-12 grade students when determining the eligibility of non-corresponding transfer students."

Items Discussion/ Action Taken:

- 1. Section VII Proposal: Remove "Contestants shall not be promoted to a higher classification within the modified program or to a junior varsity or varsity team after completion of fifty percent of their modified schedule" from the NYSPHSAA Handbook. Matt W. Came out of Section VII. APP kids played at modified level and then tried to move up to JV. Why is there a 50% rule? Todd said it will be discussed on Friday at Modified Committee. Dr. Zayas if it were to be removed, would there be concerns? Pat he would have concerns because APP is for exceptional athletes. Who will keep track of how many games these students are playing? Adam thinks the whole purpose of 50% is to help make the decision. Marisa agrees and thinks people would abuse this change. Dr. Zayas this rule protects students and athletic directors. Tim the APP process is not used to fill roster spots. Russ From small school perspective, schools will end up with angry parents because of cancellation of games. However, the reality is in small schools it is done to keep programs alive. Matt this is a small school issue. Trying to keep teams on the field. Dr. Zayas this will go to Modified Committee and be reported to Executive Committee this discussion was held. Todd Modified Committee changed this rule to allow 9th grade students to be promoted at any time during the season.
- 2. Section 2 Proposal: The 13 public school districts in the State that operate to serve students in grades K-8 only, may merge to form multiple "modified" teams. If the K-8 student who participates at the modified level, transfers to a different school with which the K-8 district contracts, the student would be subject to the NYSPHSAA Transfer Rule. Dr. Zayas asked if there were any concerns with this proposal. Robbie students are choosing which school to participate in 6th grade, but they are not exposed to what academic programs are in the high school until 8th grade. We may get ourselves in a difficult situation because kids are choosing their high school in 6th grade. Further discussion ensued. Dr. Zayas asked if there was any support for this proposal. Matt What is the advantage if this gets passed? Todd they want to merge with multiple schools so kids can play/attend schools they will attend for high school. Adam What happens in open enrollment districts? Todd one merger per sport. There was no support for the proposal moving forward.
- 3. Clinicians: Section IV has requested information related to clinicians. This was a Sectional Concern at the 2022 Central Committee meeting. Dr. Zayas should the handbook include or



reference the NYSED regulation related to clinicians? If so, where? Todd — Section IV brought a clinician to pitch with a team. A clinician is just like a coach. Adults cannot compete against high school students. Further discussion ensued with examples of coaches facilitating practice. Matt W. — Slippery slope indicating what coaches can do. Julie- there is a difference between a coach pitching and bringing someone in to replicate a game scenario. Russ — This is a coaching certification issue. Robbie — Stay away from telling how a coach can facilitate practice. Adam — There is a difference between bringing someone in to work on technical skills vs. competing against students. Dr. Zayas — Could Todd and him examine representation rule and SED regulation? Renee — trying to clarify SED regulation is not ideal. In addition, she does not believe a judge will believe batting practice is competition. Discussion ensued. Robbie — make a note in the Handbook and link to SED regulation. Matt — Agreed. Dr. Zayas and Todd will put something together for the next meeting.

- **4. Mixed Competition:** Currently the Mixed Competition portion of the NYSPHSAA Handbook states: "NYSPHSAA Note: This clause is to meet the needs of the exceptionally talented girl." Dr. Zayas Should NYSPHSAA include a "note" when it pertains to an NYSED regulation? Dr. Zayas recommends removing that note. All members agreed. Will make this a discussion item and then action in February.
- 5. Transfer Rule: The NYSPHSAA Transfer Rule states: "At no time during the one-year period of ineligibility at the varsity level should a student participate in a scrimmage or be an exhibition participant at the varsity level." Dr. Zayas Should "exhibition" be removed from the transfer rule and only have a prohibition on "scrimmage"? Todd this comes from the sport of Cross Country. A student is eligible to JV and goes to varsity meet. Can they run in that meet and not score? Pat doesn't that give individual students more rights than a team player? Matt- Why do we differentiate between scrimmage or exhibition? Marisa Believes it is not fair to team sports. Todd Team sports do not have exhibition games. Russell Taking situations that have been handled and will create more problems moving forward if we try to legislate too much. There is no support for the proposal.
- 6. Transfer Rule: The NYSPHSAA Transfer Rule states: "Health and Safety Appeals are considered for safety, mental health, personal relationships and other similar circumstances. Written documentation is required from Superintendent of Schools or High School Principal of the sending school indicating the specific circumstances which necessitated the transfer. Supporting documentation from a third party outside of the school may be submitted (ex. police report). Dr. Zayas Should the transfer rule waivers or exceptions mention DASA? Robbie if we list DASA, we aren't listing the myriad of other things that happen within a school. Dr. Zayas Transfer form sections use has DASA on it. The form is not consistent or required by NYSPHSAA. There was no support to add DASA.

Status Updates:

- 1. NYSPHSAA Jewelry Rule NYSPHSAA has removed the NYSPHSAA Jewelry Rule and will follow the sport specific rule as it relates to Jewelry. Beads are now allowed to be worn in any sport if they are secured to the head and do not pose any increased risk to any student athlete. Religious Headwear is allowed in any sport if it secured.
- 2. **Anyone Can Save a Life** Schools are encouraged to utilize the Anyone Can Save a Life program in their interscholastic program. Team should develop an EAP in case of an emergency medical situation.
- 3. **BIANYS Update** Aimee Brunell provided an update on the updates to the Concussion Management Law with the NYS Legislators. She also provided an update on a grant that BIANYS is working on with the NYSATA and an opportunity for NYSPHSAA member schools to take advantage of a Concussion Outreach Program and Education (COPE). If schools want more information, please feel free to reach out to Aimee.
- 4. **Tornado Policy** NYSPHSAA did approve a Tornado Policy for regular and post season play. The policy can be found in the NYSPHSAA Handbook and on the NYSPHSAA website. The NYSPHSAA staff will include it in the coordinator manual as well.

Items Discussion/ Action Taken:

1. Girls Lacrosse Headgear - Todd Nelson informed the Safety Committee that the NFHS and USA Lacrosse is not inclined to mandate the use of headgear for girls' lacrosse. They will continue to monitor the situation and request further studies. Liz Parry and Jeremy Thode represented the NYSPHSAA Girls Lacrosse Committee. They expressed that the committee was unanimous that they did not want to recommend mandating head gear for girl's lacrosse. The Girls Lacrosse Committee feels the rules allow for teams and players to wear headgear if they want to and the evidence for NYS does not support the need to mandate the use of headgear. They commented that during the past 2022 Lacrosse Championship not one player chose to wear the headgear. A vast majority of the NYSPHSAA Safety Committee echoes the sentiments of the Lacrosse Committee. The Certified Athletic Trainers reported that they did not see an increase amount of head injuries in their areas and appreciated the fact that the rules did allow players to wear the headgear if they chose to do so. Aimee Brunell reported that BIANYS would support following the science and the results of the studies that have been conducted. Overall, based on the studies that have been conducted and the few amounts of head injuries in NYS neither the Girls Lacrosse Committee nor the NYSPHSAA Safety Committee are recommending the mandating of headgear for Girls Lacrosse at this time. If the national governing bodies decide to make a



- change in the rules regarding headgear in girls lacrosse, then NYSPHSAA would respect and follow the rules.
- 2. Possession Clock for Boys and Girls Lacrosse NYSPHSAA requested the NFHS discuss the possibility of instituting a rule for a possession clock in both boys and girls lacrosse. There is not a desire from NFHS to implement such a rule at this time. The NFHS has suggested that NYSPHSAA request a pilot program to the NFHS to allow for a possession clock for the 2024 season. NYSPHSAA Boys and Girls Lacrosse Committees will work in putting a request into the NFHS. Both committees feel that this will help minimize risk to student athletes, especially in the girl's lacrosse game.
- 3. Lightning Policy The Safety Committee has discussed updating the Lightning policy to include the use of technology for several years. They examined the use of spheric maps from Earth Networks but that application was too cumbersome for users to use. Earth Networks presented a new product they have developed called spheric connect. They will provide free trial periods for anyone on the Safety Committee that would like to try the app. Spheric Connects seems to be more user friendly and warnings are based on the location of someone cell phone. Schools would need multiple licenses to give to multiple individuals during the season. There is a cost per license. Jim Rose and Jarett Rhoads have also been looking into a free app called My Lighting Tracker. This app seems to be very user friendly and there is no cost to use the app. Jim and Jarrett are still working on determining the reliability of the app. They will be contacting the company to see more information on the reliability. This topic will be on the agenda for the Spring meeting and a possible recommendation to go to the Executive Committee.
- 4. Modified Recommendation The Safety Committee does not have any concerns with the modified recommendation to recommend the use of mouth guards by modified goalies instead of requiring the use of mouth guards for modified goalies. Jim and Todd presented a discussion item regarding the possibility of adding 6th graders to be eligible for interscholastic sports. This regulation would have to be changed by SED but the modified committee did have an initial discussion and wanted the input form the Safety Committee. Most of the committee did express concern over including 6th graders in the interscholastic program. Their concerns revolved around maturity levels of the 6th graders and the time that interscholastic sports have as compared to youth sports. They also expressed the concern that another level of teams would add more responsibility for the athletic departments. The other ancillary concern was lack of coaches and officials for another level of teams.

Proposal

The NYSPHSAA Football Committee is seeking approval of an amendment to the Combined Practice guidelines for 11-man football.

Effective Start Date

August 19, 2023

Rationale

In 2019 the NYSPHSAA Football State Committee established guidelines for interschool practices. Five items make up the framework of these guidelines. Items d) and e) are being proposed to be revised.

CURRENT GUIDELINES:

- a) Coaches are to instruct their own players.
- b) "Full Live" contact is permitted but not required.
- c) Athletes/Teams may not participate in a combined practice unless they previously completed five (5) days of practice.
- d) While working on team situational aspects, drills may not exceed seven (7) players from either team. This will allow for teams to conduct a 7 v 7 period for skill positions or it may be designed to focus on an inside run package to emphasize offensive/defensive line play.
- e) Schools using more than seven (7) players in a team drill will be in violation of this rule.

PROPOSED CHANGES:

- d) While working on team situational aspects, drills may not exceed a maximum of nine (9) players from either team. This will allow for teams to conduct a 9 v 9 period for skill positions or it may be designed to focus on an inside run package to emphasize offensive/defensive line play.
- ** 8-Man Football teams will only be allowed a maximum of seven (7) players from either team.
- e) 11-Man teams using more than nine (9) players in a team drill will be in violation of this rule. 8-Man teams using more than seven (7) players in a team drill will be in violation of this rule.

The rationale for the request centers on allowing teams to work on inside run play with a full line. Currently, with the 7 v7 rule in place, a team that uses a tight end with two running backs can't run full line drills. They would need to use 5 linemen plus the tight end and quarterback and they are already at the maximum of 7 without counting the running backs. As a result, teams are forced to go half line and not incorporate any backside linemen. Most teams utilize pulling lineman from the back side when

executing inside run play. If the rule is modified to read a maximum of 9 players, teams could use 5 linemen, a tight end, and 2 running backs to get a true evaluation and a more productive drill.

When the state committee established these guidelines, the 7 v 7 rule was put in for two reasons:

- 1. There needed to be a clear distinction that these drills were not actually scrimmages with 11 on 11 so the decision was made to max out at 7 v 7 so it would be clear to all, it was not an 11 on 11 full team scrimmage. We believe modifying this rule will still accomplishes that same premise while allowing for a more productive teaching period for athletes. Anyone viewing this period will still note the offense has no wide receivers and the defense has no defensive backs. It will still be evident to all that this is not an 11 on 11 situation.
- 2. If more than 7 v 7 was permitted, 8-Man teams would have a full line-up thus making it a scrimmage. With that, we would only be asking for this modification be implemented for 11-Man football.

It should also be noted the original decision to max at 7 v 7 had nothing to do with safety. As mentioned, it was simply put in so there was a distinction between the combined practice and a scrimmage. This change would still honor that premise.

Proposal Originated:

The NYSPHSAA Girls Flag Football Committee met for the first time on September 14, 2022.

Budget Impact:

There will be travel expenses for schools to send a flag football team to a state championship in addition to NYSPHSAA incurring expenses to rent a venue, pay for officials and awards, travel, and also pay for other associated state tournament expenses. Additionally, schools/sections/NYSPHSAA will generate revenue from admissions at local games, Section tournaments and the State Tournament to help offset budgets.

Other

Each section will send a representative to a Regional competition (see proposed regions below) for the right to advance to the State Semifinals/Finals. Teams will be made up of 15-30 players and follow the NFHS Football Rules supplemented by the NYSPHSAA Flag Football rules. They will also adopt all high school sports standards as published in the NYSPHSAA handbook.

- SEEDING AND DEVELOPMENT OF BRACKETS:

 Teams are placed on the bracket using the following guidelines:

 -The NUMBER OF SEEDING PTS (based on the formula which tallies returning sectional points and returning wrestlers) will determine the seeds.
 - -Should any teams have the same total points, # of points earned in the prior year sectional tournament will be used as the tie breaker.
 - -The top 2 seeded D1 teams will all earn any BYEs needed to fill the bracket.
 - -The team with the most points will be entered on the bracket sheet as the #1 seed and remaining seeds will also be based on the most points earned from the seeding formula.

 -There are no wrestlebacks or consolation matches in this tournament, the winner must beat all.

Should more than the allotted number apply, they will be wait-listed. A first draft of the bracket will be sent during the summer. The finalized bracket shall be presented at the November Section 9 Athletic Council meeting for final approval before it is made official. The official bracket could change the week following the end of weight certifications in November if transfers not originally accounted for become known, math errors in applying the point formula are discovered, or if teams become aware they cannot fill the required number of weight classes. Once possible changes are made after weight certs are completed the D1 bracket will then be locked in. Once locked in, if a D1 team scratches, the D1 bracket will not be re-done, the team scheduled to wrestle the scratched team will advance by forfeit. In D1: The wait-listed team will move into the bracket as the 15th seed- on the Bye line and wrestle the #2 seed. If a D2 seeded team scratches, a wait-listed team can be added. The D2 bracket will be redrawn. No changes will be made to the D2 bracket after the Tuesday prior (1/3/23). Scratches after that point will become Forfeits.

Teams may meet teams from their league in any round. Brackets will not be adjusted because teams are also scheduled to meet during the season. As the S9 Duals bracket draft will be available in September: this gives schools plenty of time to adjust schedules. With consent of both Athletic Directors, teams may count their match in the Section 9 Duals as their league match. This gives more flexibility in scheduling opponents you are not originally scheduled to wrestle.
