Girls Wrestling - Free Style Wrestling

Proposal: The NYSPHSAA Girls Wrestling Committee is recommending that NYSPHSAA Girls wrestle free style wrestling as opposed to folk style wrestling.
Effective Start Date: 2024-2025 school year
Rationale: The Committee feels that freestyle wrestling is a better form of wrestling for our student athletes. The NCAA currently wrestles free style for the women's program, and this would allow our female athletes path like the boys who wrestle folkstyle in both High School and College. Many of our female wrestler participate in freestyle tournaments in the off season. As we move into a state championship this recommendation would help separate the sport of wrestling from the boys and give the female wrestlers their own identity.

Budgetary Impact: Schools would need to hire coaches that are familiar with free style wrestling.

The NYSPHSAA Baseball State Committee is seeking approval of a "Battery Week" to allow pitchers and catchers to start one week earlier than players who do not pitch or catch. All Battery Week players would still be required to practice for 10 days before the first contest. Other components to this proposal:

- 1. All non-pitchers and non-catchers will start on the approved NYSPHSAA established start date for all spring sports and will be required to practice for 6 days before the first contest.
- 2. Rules and restrictions during Battery Week:
 - a. Only pitchers and catchers will be permitted during Battery Week and these practices will only count for pitchers and catchers.
 - b. No pitching to live batters.
 - c. No batting practice permitted during Battery Week for any player during this period.
 - Fielding, throwing, and conditioning workouts, along with position-specific skill work for pitchers and catchers are ONLY permitted during Battery Week approved practices.
 - e. No team practices are permitted during Battery Week.
 - f. Battery Week practices will follow all NYSPHSAA practice guidelines.

PRACTICE SESSIONS:

- Only one practice session per day.
- No student may be permitted to practice on 7 consecutive days during Battery Week.
- Only six days of Battery Week may be counted towards the 10 total practice sessions required for pitchers and catchers.
- All required practice sessions shall be organized and planned for a reasonable length
 of time and shall include vigorous activity specific to the sport for the purpose of
 improving the physical condition of the players attending.
- Any "late addition" pitcher who does not attend Battery Week is required to fulfill the 10-day practice rule before pitching in a contest.

Rationale:

Pitcher arm health and safety is the main priority in this proposal. By providing these additional days of practice, pitchers will be more prepared to pitch in preseason scrimmages.

The current 10-day practice rule for baseball limits the opportunity for programs to schedule scrimmages prior to the regular season game start date. Scrimmages are vital team assessment and preparation opportunities that this proposal seeks to nurture while still adhering to the 10-day practice rule for pitchers and catchers.

- This will allow flexibility for scheduling scrimmages.
- Baseball will now have the same start date for scrimmages as lacrosse, softball and track have.

Proposal Originated:

Sean Burns, Section VIII Baseball Coordinator. The proposal was initially presented to the Baseball State Committee in January 2023 and was returned to the sections for input. Section VIII unanimously voted to bring this forward at the next NYSPHSAA Executive Committee meeting and did so on May 3, 2023 as a Sectional Concern. The proposal was sent back to the Baseball State Committee for consideration on June 9, 2023. A motion, second and unanimous vote to support this proposal was filed by the Baseball Committee during that meeting with all coordinators present.

B. SEEDING AND DEVELOPMENT OF BRACKETS:

The week weight certifications end all teams that wish to participate will submit their best anticipated January lineup by weight (assuming the +2-pound weight allowance has gone into effect). The weight certifications will determine the lowest weight class each wrestler can compete at. Coaches will also note any weight classes they will not be able to fill.

-Once received the Section Chairman and/or Asst. Chairman will assign point values to the submitted lineups as follows: Based on prior year Sectional place: 6 pts for 1st or 2nd place, 5 pts for 3rd place, 4 pts for 4th place, 3 pts for 5th or 6th place. Each returning non-placer who was seeded will earn 2 pts. Each returning non-placer who was "line-seeded" will earn 1 pt. Projected forfeits will cause a -6 point deduction. Total points per team will be tallied and used as the teams seeding point value.

-Should any teams have the same total points, # of points earned in the prior year sectional

tournament will be used as the tie breaker.

-An adjustment factor is used when teams change Divisions from one year to the next as follows: Moving from D1 to D2: Multiply point value by 1.25 Moving from D2 to D1: Multiply point value by 0.60

14-D1 Teams and 8-D2 Teams are placed on the bracket using the following guidelines:

- -The NUMBER OF SEEDING PTS (based on the above formula) will determine the seeds.
- -The top 2 seeded D1 teams will all earn any BYEs needed to fill the bracket.
- -The top 6 teams with the most points will be entered on the bracket sheet as the #1-#6 seeds. Remaining teams will then be entered as the next available seeds, however any time two teams from the same league that are ranked #7 or lower end up meeting each other, the lower of the two seeds will be switched with the seed below them, so as to avoid two teams from the same league meeting in the first round.
- -There are no wrestlebacks or consolation matches in this tournament, the winner must beat all.
- -This will be the initial draft bracket and will be distributed Thanksgiving weekend.
- -The final bracket will be distributed the Sunday prior to the return from Christmas break. Changes to the draft bracket could occur if transfers not originally accounted for become known, math errors in applying the point formula are discovered, if teams become aware they cannot fill the required number of weight classes or if Head to Heads have occurred.

Any team that defeated a top 6 seeded team in a dual meet prior to Christmas break will be able to jump that seeded team, unless they are blocked by a team in-between them who beat them head-to-head, in which case they would move up to the block. (This mirrors the procedure for seeding used in our individual tournament and those procedures will be used to determine the final seeds).

Should more than the allotted number of teams by division apply, they will be wait-listed. Once a bracket becomes official, if a D1 team scratches, the D1 bracket will not be re-done, the team scheduled to wrestle the scratched team will advance by forfeit. In D1: the wait-listed team will move into the bracket as the 15th seed- on the Bye line and wrestle the #2 seed. If a D2 seeded team scratches, a wait-listed team can be added. The D2 bracket will be redrawn. No changes will be made to the D2 bracket after the Tuesday prior (1/2/24). Scratches after that point will become Forfeits.

With consent of both Athletic Directors, teams may count their match in the Section 9 Duals as their league match. This gives more flexibility in scheduling opponents you are not originally scheduled to wrestle.

C. <u>DETERMINING OUR AT-LARGE ENTRY FOR NYS DUALS:</u>

Each section can determine the way they will determine their entry and At-Large bid for the NYS Duals. The S9 Duals Champ will represent S9 at the NYS Duals. The runner-up team shall be the team allowed to submit the At-Large bid with the following exception: Any team whose NYS At-Large bid form has a higher point value than the runner-up team shall replace the runner-up team as our At-Large bid entry, so long as they were not defeated by the runner-up team at any time during the season or during the S9 Dual Meet tournament. The NYS Duals At-Large bid form must be submitted by Wed 1/17/24.

Proposal:

The Boys and Girls Indoor Committees are seeking approval to add a second division for the 4×200 , 4×400 and 4×800 relays at the State Championships. This proposal does not apply to the Intersectional Relay.

Effective Start Date:

Winter 2024-25

Rationale:

Our committee discussed the difficulty of schools that would be considered Division 2 by enrollment numbers (under 600 students) to have a relay team qualify for the State meet due to the Indoor Track and Field State Championships utilizing only one division. The Committee felt strongly that Track and Field is an individual sport and would like to remain one division for individual events, but felt that relay events requiring more individuals is more difficult with less student athletes to draw from. Our committee brought this idea back to their Sections and the response from the Sections was overwhelmingly in favor.

Proposal Originated:

Boys and Girls Indoor Track Committees at their June 14, 2023 meeting

Budgetary Impact:

Sections will have an increased cost including transportation, lodging and meals for additional athletes (6 additional relay teams-3 Girls, 3 Boys). NYSPHSAA may have additional facility rental costs depending on how much additional time is needed in the venue to conduct Division 2 relays. NYSPHSAA will also incur an additional cost for awards and champion t-shirts for the Division 2 relay winners.

Notes:

The Girls and Boys Committee voted in favor of this proposal at its August 29, 2023 meeting. The Girls Committee was in favor by a 7-1 vote and the Boys Committee was in favor by a 6-1 vote. Of note, both "No" votes were based on concerns of limited facilities in their respective Section.
