- ▶ Once an individual competes on a team for one sex during the season, he/she may not compete for or against a team organized for the other sex during that season

 - Co-sponsored by outside agency
- ▶ Interstate – Participation
 - Check with NYSPHSAA office
- ▶ Interstate – Dual Team contest
 - Check to confirm the school is a member or approved by their home State Athletic Association

Sanctioning (p 96)



- International Hosting
 - Application 60 days prior
 - Team representing a secondary school
 - In season and counted (out of season)
 - Report to NFHS
- International Participation
 - Not within 4 weeks of the start of the season
 - Section must approve, league schedules may not be altered
 - Follow our sports standards

Outside Agencies (p 99)

Transfer (p 105)



- ▶ With a corresponding change of parent address = student is eligible
- ▶ Without a corresponding change of address
 - Ineligible for 1 year – sport specific
- ▶ Appeals
 - Academic, health & safety, financial
- ▶ *NEW* – Students who return from any school to the public school of the residence of his/her parents (or other persons with whom the student has resided for at least six months) or a private school within that district's boundaries shall be exempted from the transfer rule once in a high school career.

Senior All Star Contests (p 102)

REMOVED FROM HANDBOOK

Chair Reports:

- a. Girls and Boys Modified Sports – Brian Devincenzi
 1. With sectional and league approval, the libero player may be used at the modified level. – League discussion.
 2. Mercy Rule Experiment with Softball and Baseball – with sectional/league approval a mercy rule experiment in modified baseball and softball will be permitted, allowing a game to end after the fifth inning when a team at the short end of the 15 run rule has completed their fifth at bat.
 3. With sectional/league approval, a two-year pilot program in modified wrestling may be implemented that allows modified wrestlers who compete in two or three bouts in a contest to wrestle using the time periods for bouts of program 2: 1st period – 1 minute, 2nd and 3rd periods – 1 and 1 ½ minutes.
 4. With sectional/league approval, a two-year pilot program in modified track and field maybe implemented that would increase the height of the hurdle in the 55m modified boy's event from 30 inches to 33 inches.
 5. Action Item:
Modified wrestling condition shall be edited to read: There must be a 45 minute rest period between bouts. - Approved -

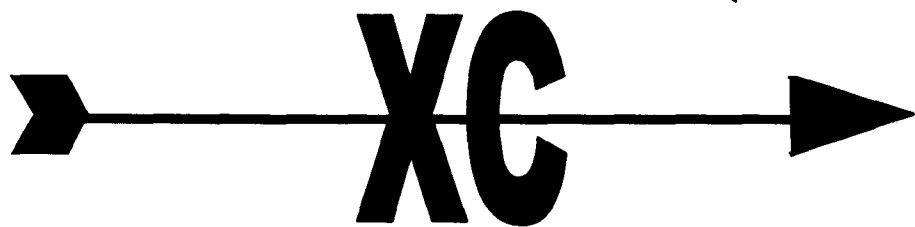

ATHLETICS AND POTENTIAL SAVINGS

- 1. Awards – Eliminate Runner-Up Plaques awarded by Section IX Athletics.**
- 2. The Section IX Secretary stipend currently not being paid to anyone remains that way.**
- 3. Reduce the number of days for Section IX Spring Track meets to a two day meet Class A & D on one day and Class B and C meets on another day.**
- 4. The Spring State Qualifier meet reduce from a two day meet to a one day meet.**
- 5. Reduce the number of Sectional qualifiers for Boys/Girls Tennis and Boys/Girls Golf. This would reduce transportation costs for school districts.**
- 6. Use the bid process to select Section IX Transportation to NYSPHSAA events.**
