NYSPHSAA MONTHLY UPDATE JANUARY 2012

HIGHLIGHTS FOR MODIFIED PROGRAM

MODIFIED SOFTBALL - Approved with section/league approval, innings 1-6 may be completed at five (5) runs or three (3) outs. The seventh inning shall be played as a normal inning, with three outs and no run restrictions for that inning.

MODIFIED TRACK and FIELD - Approved with section/league approval, the height of the hurdle in the 55m modified boys' hurdles may be increased from 30 inches to 33 inches and approved with section/league approval, a six (6) pound shot put may be used for modified girls' track and field, rather than a 4K shot put.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

PREVENT SKIN INFECTIONS - The Skin Infection Webinar has been recorded and is available on the NYSPHSAA website on December 1st for anyone wishing to learn more about preventing the spread of skin infections.

SKIN INFECTION OUTBREAKS – With a few reported skin infection outbreaks already this year, the NYSPHSAA has developed a guide to help schools address a potential skin infection outbreak. CONCUSSION MANAGEMENT REMINDER – The new Concussion Management Law will go into effect on July 1, 2012. The NYSPHSAA is waiting on the proposed regulations and requirements from the NYS Education Department and the NYS Department of Health. We have shared our recommendations to both agencies. Schools should begin discussions on how to address the new law and we will pass along any updates as soon as available. A draft policy and guidelines can be found on the NYSPHSAA website. FUTURE CONSIDERATION

GIRLS LACROSSE - Will be requesting to waive the 3" side panel and trim around the neck on uniforms for the 2012-2013 season.

GIRLS GOLF - To allow competitors to use non-motorized push or pull carts during league, sectional or NYSPHSAA championship competition.

FOOTBALL SCRIMMAGES - The minimum nights of rest rule for a scrimmage and/or a contest will be 4 nights.

MODIFIED COMMITTEE - Requested the Safety Committee to discuss the following items:

Football - A two year pilot to allow kick-offs at the modified level for football.

Baseball - Discuss the limits on the number of innings a student athlete can pitch in a game and week. A request was made by a Section to consider counting the number of pitches that are made instead of the number of innings that are pitched.

NFHS SPORT RULE CHANGES

BOYS LACROSSE - All hollow crosse handles must have their open end covered with a plastic or rubber end cap manufactured for a lacrosse stick.

GIRLS LACROSSE - The goalkeeper's stick may be 35.5"-52" in length (previously 35.5—48"). The goalkeeper's helmet must include a chin strap which must be fastened.

RE:: INELIGIBLE WRESTER - JOE GINLEY - WARWICK VALLEY

On Saturday 12/3/11, the first weekend of wrestling (just after weight certifications were completed), Warwick competed in the MacArthur Tournament on Long Island. Joe Ginley had been certified at 122 but entered the tournament and wrestled at 120. He was not eligible to compete at this weight class until 12/25/11 (when the 2 lb growth allowance goes into effect). He was therefore an ineligible wrestler.

The violation was not intentional. It was an oversight by the Warwick coaching staff as well as the person administering weigh-in's (as each wrestlers certified weight is listed on the weigh-in form and it should have been caught at the scale). Warwick was not looking to benefit from the infraction. They are literally hundreds of numbers that wrestling coaches have to check and sometimes something goes unnoticed.

The NYSWC has addressed this issue in it's handbook (pg 31) (as it is not uncommon). The penalty is also addressed in the NYS Handbook (pg 101).

INELIGIBLE WEIGHT CLASS

After a dual is wrestled, it is found out that a team used a wrestler at a weight lower than his/her certified weight (or at a weight above the State minimum weight: (Example: 8th grade 85 pounder wrestles at 99 and does not meet the 91 pound minimum), the team forfeits the dual meet and the wrestler takes a loss on his/her record. The won/loss records of the other wrestlers who wrestled in the dual meet are not affected and the results of their individual bouts stand. (NYSPHSAA Handbook-Penalties).

While this definition is for a dual meet, it also applies to tournaments. The wrestler forfeits all of their matches, the place finishers are adjusted, and the team loses all their team points.

NYS Handbook page 101

- 2. Individual Sports. Participation by an ineligible contestant in any post schedule tournament competition (sectional, intersectional or state championship) shall result in the forfeiture of that competition. The contestant will be disqualified from the tournament immediately and his/her last opponent will advance in their place. Individuals eliminated prior to the last opponent will not reenter the tournament competition.
- (d) For any violation of eligibility or sports standards a school or a school authority may be censured, placed on probation, or suspended by the Section Athletic Council.
- (e) Consistent with good ethical standards the prompt reporting of the knowledge of an infraction shall be made to the proper authorities in writing.
- (f) School Districts may appeal to the Section to gain relief from the prescribed penalty if the violation of eligibility standards resulted from circumstances out of the District's control.

As soon as Warwick became aware of the violation (approximately 3 days later) they self reported it. Warwick had won the team title and Joe Ginley had placed first at 120 lbs by going 3-0. MacArthur (the host school) was notified and the coaches of the teams that Joe Ginley wrestled against were instructed to change their results from losses, to: Wins By Forfeit. The Warwick team score was removed and recorded as 0.0 points. The team places and individual places were all adjusted.

Item (d) in the state handbook states "a school or a school authority may be censured, placed on probation, or suspended by the Section Athletic Council" My recommendation would be that a censure, probation, or suspension is <u>not</u> needed in this situation. This was not an intentional violation but an oversight. The team and wrestler have already penalized in accordance with the rules. They self reported the incident as soon as it was brought to their attention. My only recollection of a similar incident was several years ago in a dual meet. Minisink used a wrestler at an ineligible weight class in their first dual meet vs Newburgh. The same penalty applied as they forfeited the dual meet and the result of wrestler involved was changed to a loss by forfeit. I do not recall that any censure, probation, or suspension was given. Past precedent would suggest that no further action is required with respect to this incident.
