HIGHLIGHTS - EXECUTIVE and CENTRAL COMMITTEE MEETINGS

January 22, 2012 and January 31, 2012

CLASSIFICATION NUMBERS - The Classification Numbers have been approved for 2012-2013 and will be available on the website shortly.

CHEERLEADING - Approved to begin planning for a NYSPHSAA East and West Cheerleading event for the 2012-2013 school year.

GIRLS LACROSSE - Approved a waiver to rule 2-13, 3 "side panel and trim around the neck for the 2012-2013 seasons."

FIELD HOCKEY - Approved a waiver to rule 1-5-1, player uniforms, for the 2012-2014 seasons. **SOCCER -** Approved a waiver to rule 4-1-1, i1; goal keeper jersey for the 2012-2014 seasons and a waiver to rule 4-1-1b: home white jerseys for the 2013-2015 seasons.

FOOTBALL - Approved a waiver to rule 1-5-1b, 6 and 7 for both jerseys through 2014.

WRESTLING - Approved a waiver to rule 4-1-5 to allow tape on the chin straps and straps on the top of the head gear and a waiver of the uniform rule to permit pink ribbons on the uniform in recognition of Breast Cancer Awareness initiatives during the month of February.

GIRLS SWIMMING & DIVING - Approved the revised Girls Swimming and Diving Qualifying Standards for the 2012 State Championship. Standards are on www.nysphssaa.org/sports

SOFTBALL - Approved the Class D realignment. **GIRLS GOLF** - Approved the use of a pull/push cart.

BASEBALL - Approved a change in the required number of baseball practices for a team to 10 for a scrimmage and 15 for a game at all levels.

APPEAL PROCEDURE - Approved a fee of \$300.00 for a telephone conference call appeal which will be paid for in full by the Appellant.

COLLEGE RULE - Approved the following additional language to the College Rule, "Prior to competition, the NYSPHSAA Executive Director may grant an exemption of the College Rule for an individual sport athlete when vying for a standard that would qualify them for the Olympic trials and/or Olympic Games when this opportunity is not offered through New York State Public High School Athletic Association and/or the National Federation of State High School Associations. The exemption would permit a student to participate as an "unattached" individual with no affiliation to their school team in a competition against open and college competitors in an approved competition set forth by the Olympic Committee without violating the College Rule".

FUTURE CONSIDERATION

SAFETY COMMITTEE – The committee will be discussing and considering raising the nights of rest required for football games and scrimmages to be 4 nights. Sections are asked to include the Section safety and football representative in their discussions.

MODIFIED COMMITTEE – The committee will be discussing the following items at their spring meeting. Please include all necessary representatives in the Section discussions. The items include pilot program for modified football kick – off, awards for multi-school events, baseball pitch count vs innings pitched, and a modified/JV pilot program.

REMINDERS

SKIN INFECTIONS – With Section and State Wrestling Championships in February, schools are asked to continue to be diligent and responsible when protecting all of our athletes from the spreading of any skin infections. Please refer to www.nysphsaa.org/safety for further information.

NFHS SPORT RULE CHANGES

BOYS LACROSSE - All hollow crosse handles must have their open end covered with a plastic or rubber end cap manufactured for a lacrosse stick.

GIRLS LACROSSE - The goalkeeper's stick may be 35.5"-52" in length (previously 35.5—48"). The goalkeeper's helmet must include a chin strap which must be fastened.

New York State Public High School Athletic Association Executive Committee Meeting January 22, 2012

Highlights

- 1. New Business Approval, Denial, Back to the Sections or No Action, see voting measures.
- Ms. Nina Van Erk Executive Director NYSED Concussion Regulations – Guidelines to be approved by legal counsel. Resources need to be reviewed for completion after July 1, 2012.
- 3. East & West Regional Cheerleading Event in 2012-2013

 Not a topic that SED/Regents will approve at this time. NYSPHSAA <u>approved</u> planning of an "event" for the winter season of 2012-2013.
- 4. Scholar-Athlete Team Award Program The Winter 2011-2012 Sports Season deadline is Friday, March 2, 2012. Required filing continues to be electronic on the NYSPHSAA website.

Community Service Challenge May 1, 2012 – Deadline for schools to submit projects to the Section.

June 1, 2012 – Deadline for the Sections to submit their winner to NYSPHSAA. Application is on the NYSPHSAA website.

5. Mr. Todd Nelson – Assistant Director Approve Classification of the member schools for 2012-2013 school year. Variation cutoff numbers to the Executive Committee. Discussion on the "Exemptions/Variations" classifications numbers for a two-year period beginning with the 2013-2014 school year.

Sanctioning: Concern over the sanctioning of "showcase" or "shoot out" events involving non-member schools.

Recommendation: The NYSPHSAA will approve events that have non-member schools participating provided there can be no direct competition with a non-member school. (Please note that many of these non-member schools are athletic factories and our school will be exposed to them during the event.) **Reminder:** NYSPHSAA member schools may only compete against member schools or schools approved by their state athletic association.

- 10. Handbook Committee Ms. Roberta Greene
 - A. **Appeal Process Fees:** The committee discussed the Appeal Procedure cost sharing formula. The formula calls for the Appellant to pay for one half of the expenses incurred by the panel and the remaining half is paid for by the Section and NYSPHSAA. The current procedure does not address telephone conference appeals. The committee recommends that a fee of \$300.00 be set for a telephone conference call appeal which will be paid for in full by the Appellant. **Approved**
 - B. Proposed Olympic Provision: The committee discussed the unique conflicts that a select number of student athletes are faced with when attempting to qualify for the Olympic Trials. The athletic director at North Shore High School, with Section VIII's support, proposed language that would permit these unique opportunities without affecting a student's high school eligibility. The Handbook Committee made some changes to the proposed language and recommends the following: "Prior to competition, the NYSPHSAA Executive Director may grant an exemption of the College Rule for an individual sport athlete when vying for a standard that would qualify them for the Olympic Trials and/or Olympic Games when this opportunity is not offered through New York State Public High School Athletic Association and/or the National Federation of State High School Associations. The exemption would permit a student to participate as an "unattached" individual with no affiliation to their school team in a competition against open and college competition in an approved competition set forth by the Olympic Committee without violating the College Rule." Approved

- C. **Membership in NYSPHSAA:** The committee discussed drafting language which would require all Interscholastic Athletic Programs sponsored by NYSPHSAA member schools to compete within the NYSPHSAA structure and abide by all approved rules and regulations.
- D. **Correspondence:** The committee received suggestions for a Camp Rule for High Schools and Athletic Shopping. The committee will be discussing these topics at the next Handbook Committee meeting. The committee is seeking input regarding these topics for the membership.

14. NYSPHSAA Transfer Committee

- A. Primary Residence- The members of the committee discussed the issues surrounding primary residence and the difficulties they have in determining where the students are actually living. Renee explained that the school district bears the responsibility of determining residence. However, simply by establishing residence does not grant athletic eligibility. The student must have lived with the adult for at least six (6) months prior to the change in registration from one school district to the other.
- B. Multiple High School Districts Nina explained the difficulty in dealing with the 27 multiple high school districts across the state and the inconsistency in determining eligibility for these students. There are also a handful of K-8 school districts without a high school that have contractual agreements to educate their students beyond the 8th grade with one or

more school districts. In order to foster consistency statewide, new language is needed to assist the multiple high school districts. This issue becomes further complicated because of open enrollment vs. set geographic boundaries within a school district. This discussion led to considerable discussion and the need for further clarification. Renee reminded the group that a Hardship Waiver could be granted if the circumstances warranted. The committee would like to consider the following concept:

In multiple high school districts, a student may transfer within the district once without penalty in their high school career. The appropriate Transfer forms must be filed for the student to be eligible to practice and the request must be approved for the student to be eligible to compete.

C. Waivers – The committee discussed the elimination of the financial and academic hardship waivers. The majority of the committee members felt strongly that the only waiver that should remain was the Health and Safety Waiver. The committee will work on strengthening the guidelines for this waiver.

15. Transfer Committee

- A. Discussion: Multiple High School Districts Nina reviewed the proposed language and reviewed the purpose of the change. Ed Cinelli raised a concern regarding the one transfer without penalty and the four multiple high school districts within the Section are opposed to this change. The members of the committee did not feel that this change was necessary to make at this time. Therefore, any student living in a multiple high school district declares the district of residence once they enroll and enter the 9th grade. Any subsequent transfer would be subject to the Transfer Rule.
- B. Hardship Waivers The committee debated the purpose and the need for the current hardship waivers. Since the majority of financially based transfers fall under the District of Residence Waiver, the committee discussed that the Financial Hardship be eliminated from the rule. The committee will include financial hardship with the guidelines for undue hardship. Regarding academic hardship, the committee felt this is a topic of great concern. After considerable discussion and debate, the committee was almost split as to whether the Association should eliminate the Academic Hardship Waiver. A straw vote of the committee members was too close to move forward with a specific recommendation.

Committee members were asked to seek input from the schools in their respective sections. The committee will meet in a few months to provide enough time for the representatives to present the pros and cons of this issue. This will enable the committee to make an informed recommendation to the NYSPHSAA Executive Committee in May.

Pursuant to the provisions of the NYSPHSAA, Inc. Constitution, Article VIII, Amendments, the 16 proposals which were accepted for the 2012 Referendum of the member schools by the Executive Committee are submitted below.

After the vote on each Proposition is indicated and the necessary signatures affixed (see Article VII (2), NYSPHSAA Handbook, page 36, the enclosed ballot is to be mailed to the designated Teller before ______, 2012.

PROPOSALS FOR 2012 REFERENDUM

SHALL THE NYSPHSAA, INC. CONSITUTION BE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

Proposition # 1: Article | PURPOSE - Handbook p. 29 | Item 7 - Delete ... "improve safety" replace with "minimize risk". (Rationale: The term "minimize risk" best reflects current practices.)

Proposition # 2: Article II MEMBERSHIP - Handbook p. 29 Item 1 a – Amend to read "The annual membership fee shall be based on the total school district enrollment of boys and girls listed on all attendance registers for Grades 7-12 inclusive from the latest enrollment data provided by NYSED. Annual membership fees shall be set by the Executive Committee. An alternative method for the calculation of member dues assessment may be adopted by the NYSPHSAA Executive Committee. (Rationale: Clarifies actual procedure and gives flexibility for future change).

Proposition # 3: Article II MEMBERSHIP - Handbook p. 31 Item 4 – Add to second sentence....make recommendations to the "NYSPHSAA staff and" Executive Committee... (Rationale: Clarifies the avenue to recommend change).

Proposition # 4: Article II MEMBERSHIP - Handbook p. 31 Item 5 – Add "Not-for-Profit" before the reference to Section 501 (c) 3.

(Rationale: Clarifies what a 501 (c) 3 is for the membership).

Proposition # 5: Article III Central Committee – Handbook p. 32 Item 3a - Add the Immediate Past President and add the sentences. "Sectional representatives constitute the voting body of the committee and the first vice president, second vice president and immediate past president shall have the right to vote when the Central Committee is in session". The president shall not be entitled to vote, except in the case of a tie."

(Rationale: This proposal was initiated on advice from counsel. When these officers serve on committees such as the Budget and Audit Committee and Compensation Committee, the Association will be in compliance with the IRS requirements for 501c3 Non Profit organizations. The requirement is for the majority of committee members to be voting members of the Association).

Proposition # 7: Article IV Officers and Duties – Handbook p. 32 Item 1a - Add the sentence "The president shall be an ex officio member of all NYSPHSAA committees". (Rationale: Clarifies the involvement of the Association's President).

Proposition #8: Article IV Officers and Duties – Handbook p. 32 Items 1 b 1 and 1 c 1 – Change the name of the Budget Committee to the Budget and Audit Committee. (Rationale: Reflects the changing title of the committee).

Proposition # 9: Article IV Officers and Duties – Handbook p. 32 Items 1 b 2 and 1 c 2 – Strikes the reference to attending 5 Athletic Council meetings.

(Rationale: Eliminate the reference to a specific number of Athletic Council meetings the officers would be expected to attend).

Proposition # 10: Article IV Officers and Duties – Handbook p. 33 Item 1 d 3 – Add "Member of the Budget and Audit Committee" to the duties of immediate Past President (Rationale: Reflects current practices)

Proposition # 11: Article IV Officers and Duties – Handbook p. 33 Item 1 d 3 – Add to the sentence, Officers "in consultation with the" staff,

(Rationale: Reflects current practices and eliminates staff from the committee)

Proposition # 12: Article V Executive Committee – Handbook p. 34 Item 4 – Add to the sentence Any action which needs the approval of the Executive Committee may be taken without a meeting if "authorized by the President" by conducting a mail "or electronic" vote.

(Rationale: Addresses changing technology and eliminates approval of 2/3 of the Executive Committee).

Proposition # 13: Article VII State Sports Committee – Handbook p. 35 Item 1 a – Add to the sentence, The Executive Committee shall appoint a coordinator upon the recommendation of the members of that state sports committee "and NYSPHSAA staff"....

(Rationale: Reflects current practices)

Proposition # 14: Article VII State Sports Committee — Handbook p. 35 Item 1 d - Change the word "mailed" to provided in the sentence, Minutes of all meetings shall be "provided" to committee members, association officers and staff, section presidents and section executive directors/secretaries. (Rationale: Addresses changing technology).

Proposition # 15: Article VII State Sports Committee – Handbook p. 35 Item 1 e – Strike reference requiring an oral report and change the sentence to, The coordinator of the state sports committee shall submit an annual written report to the Central Committee. "If requested to attend" the Central Committee meeting the necessary expenses to attend will be paid by the association. (Rationale: Reduces expenses and eliminates the need for the state sport coordinator to attend the Central Committee meeting).

Proposition # 16: Article VIII Constitutional Amendments — Handbook p. 36 Item 2 — Strike the references to "senior high school members may vote on matters pertaining to the senior high school program and junior high school members may vote on matters pertaining to the junior high school program" and "the male representative of athletics, and the female representative of athletics". Change the sentence to, During a referendum, each school shall have one vote on a signed ballot. To be valid, this vote shall represent the collective judgment of and include the signatures of the chief school officer, "high school" principal, and the "director of athletics".

(Rationale: Clarifies it is the high school principal and role of the director of athletics).
