APRIL 2012 NYSPHSAA MONTHLY UPDATE

ITEMS FOR EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CONSIDERATION

May 4 - 5, 2012 at Lake George - Holiday Inn

BOYS AND GIRLS VOLLEYBALL - Uniform waiver of NCAA rule 12.1.3.1 to allow solid libero uniform shirt for 2012 - 2014.

SAFETY COMMITTEE - Is considering raising the nights of rest required for football games and scrimmages to be 4 nights.

MODIFIED COMMITTEE - Recommends the following:

- **Football** - "Motion is allowed toward the two receiver side of the formation provided that the ball is snapped before the player in motion crosses the midline of the formation, as outlined in the modified football handbook".
- **Awards Rule #10** - "Schools will be allowed in multi-school contests and invitationals to award place ribbons to the top competitors".
- **General** - With Section and league approval a two-year pilot program to allow schools with no JV teams in a particular sport and a modified program of 7th, 8th, and 9th graders in a particular sport to follow a JV/Modified program.

BASEBALL BAT COMPLIANCE

NEW DECERTIFIED BAT - Effective immediately and until further notice, the **Reebok Vector TLS 33"** length baseball bat should be considered a non-compliant bat and subject to NFHS Baseball Rules 4-1-3b and 7-4-1a.

DECERTIFIED - Effective immediately and until further notice, the Marucci CAT5 (33" length) baseball bat should be considered a non-compliant bat and subject to NFHS Baseball Rules 4-1-3b and 7-4-1a.

APPROVED - The Rip-It baseball bat with the BBCOR .50 certification mark on the taper of the bat instead of the barrel is compliant with the NFHS baseball rules due to an administrative remedy.

NFHS SPORT RULE CHANGES

BOYS LACROSSE - All hollow crosse handles must have their open end covered with a plastic or rubber end cap manufactured for a lacrosse stick.

GIRLS LACROSSE - The goalkeeper's stick may be 35.5"-52" in length (previously 35.5"-48"). The goalkeeper's helmet must include a chin strap which must be fastened.

ITEMS TO BE BROUGHT BACK TO THE SECTIONS FOR DISCUSSION

1. Status of State Championships
 - Placing a two-year moratorium on all state championships beginning with the 2013-14 school year.
 - Curtailing the number of state championships.
2. Sites of State Championships
 - Selecting state championship sites based on a Section's desire to host.
 - Developing a new process by which members of the site selection committee are chosen.
 - Considering a change in the transportation reimbursement structure with, perhaps, the Sections closest to the championship sites receiving less and those furthest receiving more.
3. Elimination of Section uniforms in all sports and letting athletes wear their school uniforms at State Championships.
4. Suggestions for cost reductions and increased revenue.
5. Charter Schools – Are the Sections current rules and regulations working?
6. Camp Rule for High Schools and Athletic Shopping.
7. Academic Hardship Waiver – Should it be eliminated from the Transfer Rule?

These items may be discussed or voted upon at the May Executive Committee Meeting.

**Suggested Starting Point to Identify
Athletic Shopping**

A High School student shall be ineligible for one calendar year if there is any evidence of Athletic Shopping by any person associated with the transferring student.

This evidence shall involve, but not limited to:

- 1. Looking for a better program.**
- 2. Dissatisfaction with a school district system, school program or coach.**
- 3. A better chance to play or become a starter.**
- 4. A better chance to excel or get a college scholarship.**

All of the above shall include but not limited to parent, guardian, relative, care-giver, friend or student.

**A Starting Point for
CAMP RULE for High Schools**

- 1. Schools who sponsor out of season sport camps should sponsor them for only residents of their own school district.**
- 2. Non-Resident should not be permitted at school district camps to prevent impropriety.**
- 3. School district shall not conduct a sports camp in any sport that the district does not complete scholastically.**
- 4. Students who attend a sports camp, sponsored by other than the district of their residency, and who wish to transfer to another school district, shall be ineligible, in the same sport; for one calendar year after transfer if there is any coach at the new school was a coach, counselor, or instructor at any sport camp that the student attended in previously 12 months prior to transfer.**

March 2012

1. NEW GUIDELINES FOR CONCUSSION MANAGEMENT

- Guidelines currently under review by SED and DOH staff.
- Due to come out before July 1, 2012.
- Public review will be March 21st and published on the State Register. Comments accepted March 21st through May 7th.

2. NEW GUIDELINES FOR HEALTH APPRAISALS (Health Exams)

- Anticipate release in summer.
- Asking more detailed questions related to concussion and cardiac history on the health history recommended sample form.
- The process will not change.

3. SELECTION/CLASSIFICATION update

- Anticipated release in summer.
- Currently under discussion with counsel.
- Communication of details to follow.

6. **PAY TO PLAY (Reminder)**
 - School districts can not institute a "pay to play" policy for athletics.
7. **APPLYING TO BE AN APPROVED AGENCY/INSTRUCTOR FOR THE COACHING COURSES.**
 - For information on how to become an approved agency to provide the coaching courses, contact Darryl at ddaily@mail.nysed.gov
8. **NYSED COACHING FA/CPR/AED APPROVED AGENCY (Renewals)**
 - In order to maintain status as an approved provider of the NYSED Coaching and FA/CPR courses, all agencies are required to submit an agency instructor evaluation form for each instructor in their agency. These are to be sent to SED every January to maintain agency approval status (if no classes have been taught this fall, a blank form should be sent indicating this and approval will be maintained). If your agency did not receive the form or did not send in, please contact Darryl ASAP. This is only required of those agencies issuing NYSED certificates.
9. **Student Teacher and Coaching:**
 - Recent request from NYSAHPERD and NYSCPPE and several colleges for clarification on process regarding Physical Education student teachers and temporary coaching requirements:
 - Recently it was requested that clarification be made by the New York State Education Department (NYSED) as to whether a student teacher in physical education needs to obtain a temporary coaching license. It has been brought to NYSED's attention that a number of schools are currently requiring this process for student teachers.
 - Student teachers, who are required to coach as part of their student teaching experience, are not required to be certified as a temporary coach. If a student teacher is hired and being paid for coaching; however, then it would be expected that the student teacher would have secured a temporary coaching certification and be approved by the local Board of Education.

TRANSFER APPEAL GUIDELINES

NYSPHSAA TRANSFER RULE

For consideration when determining hardship waivers of the Transfer Rule

Financial – Appeals require documented proof of a significant loss of income or a significant increase in expenses.

- Written description outlining the circumstances that led to the financial hardship.
Appropriate documentation may include:
 - Evidence of loss of income or change in financial obligations that are not self imposed.
 - Family W2 forms – pay stubs.
 - Notarized statement from parent.
 - Statement from employer, attorney, accountant, social services or other professional personnel with knowledge of the circumstances.
 - Most recent tax returns – past two years.

Health and Safety – Appeals are considered for safety, mental health, personal relationships and other similar circumstances.

- Written documentation is required from Superintendent of Schools or HS principal of the sending school indicating the specific circumstances which necessitated the transfer.
- Supporting documentation from a third party outside of the school may be submitted.
Example: Police report.

Educational –

- Evidence that the student is taking three units of credit in a particular subject area or any combination of three units of credit in Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate or dual college credit courses not offered in the sending school which qualify for graduation requirements. Each dual college credit course is the equivalent of one unit of study at the high school level. The Director of Guidance or Principal of the sending school must submit a list of their school's course offerings. The Director of Guidance or Principal of the receiving school must submit a copy of the student's schedule through grade 12 and a list of course offerings. Subsequent verification of the student's schedule may be requested.
- Written documentation from Superintendent of Schools or HS principal of the sending school indicating the specific academic circumstances requiring the transfer.

Foreign Exchange student –

- Report these students through the Section office by using a standardized form.
