

SOCCER HANDBOOK
FALL 2

Tournament design:

A four- team tournament will be held.

OCIAA Classes A, B, and C the top two seeded teams will enter.

MHAL Classes A and C the top two seeded teams will enter.

MHAL Class B. The top seed of the American Conference will play the top seed of the National Conference.

Class AA will be the top four teams from the OCIAA.

Class D will have the top seed team from both leagues, a two- team play-off.

All games will be played at the top seed teams site. **SCHOOLS MUST ABIDE BY THE SECTION POLICY OF 2 SPECTATORS ALLOWED PER PLAYER. IF THIS IS NOT ACCEPTABLE, NOTICE MUST BE GIVEN PRIOR TO THE START OF THESE GAMES SO ALTERNATE SITES CAN BE LOCATED.**

Round 1 will be played between the same county teams thus reducing inter county travel.

The final game in A, B, C, and D will be between the two counties.

The game will be held at the top seed teams site.

SEEDING:

For all OCIAA Classes and MHAL Classes A, C and D.

Same Class league games will be used for seeding. The (6-6-3) established Section 9 procedure will be used. Included in packet.

For MHAL B teams: The American Conference winner will play the National Conference winner.

OCIAA Class AA, all AA league and cross over games will be used for seeding. (Division I and Division II games)

For all COVID CANCELLATION: **3 points will be awarded** to teams for games canceled due to COVID restrictions.

TIE BREAKER:

1. Head to Head.
2. Goals allowed Head to Head.
3. Over-all points per game divided by number of total games. COVID CANCELLATION POINTS INCLUDED.
4. (3-0-1) 3 points for a win, 0 points for a loss and 1 point for a tie.
5. Coin toss

SITE FOR FINAL:

If needed the Tie Breaker procedures #'s 3 and 4 will be used to establish a top seed team to host finals. If a top seed can-not be determined for the final game in A, B, C, and D games will be hosted in the following counties.

- A. Boys OCIAA, Girls MHAL
- B. Boys MHAL, Girls OCIAA
- C. Boys OCIAA, Girls MHAL

D. Boys MHAL, Girls OCIAA

E. AA teams will be seeded 1-4 for the event.

After your final game is played please return the score card to your Class representative and the Chairperson. Included in packet.

Dates for Culminating Event:

Sunday April 18th Girls opening Round. **1 PM**

Monday April 19th Boys opening Round, Girls Finals. **4 PM**

Tuesday April 20th Boys Finals. **4 PM**

On Monday schools may be hosting 2 games.

AD's have the right to change game times provided:

1 Both AD's agree.

2 Chair-people are notified.

3 The Section Office is notified so officials can be informed.

4 Spectators, coaches, and players are informed.

Ball Runners.

Both teams should provide ball runners for the final culminating event.

Over time rules.

Please note that over time procedures differ between boys and girls soccer.

Girls Over time.

Two fully played 10 minute periods. If still tied

Two 5 minute SUDDEN VICTORY periods. If still tied

Penalty kicks. According to National Federation Rules.

Boys Over time.

Two 15 minute SUDDEN VICTORY periods. If still tied

Penalty kicks. According to National Federation Rules.

Penalty kicks for boys and girls.

If the score is still tied after the 5th kicker. On the 6th kicker penalty kicks become SUDDEN VICTORY.

Site supervision.

The Home-school Athletic Director will be in charge of the site and hosting the event.

Protest committee

A protest committee will be on site for the final culminating event.

These people are to introduce themselves to the host AD prior to the contest.

APPENDIX B - Coaches Code of Conduct

Section IX Athletics Greg Ransom, Executive Director

Section IX Coaches Code of Conduct

In order to ensure that the principles of sportsmanship, fair play, skill development, and mutual respect among players, coaches, officials and spectators are the primary considerations governing competition in Section IX, the following Code of Conduct has been established and adopted.

Each coach shall:

1. Know the rules and abide by them. Instruct team members in the rules and coach their team in such a way as to motivate each player to compete according to the rules at all times.
2. Respect the game officials and refrain from questioning their decisions in a disrespectful and abusive manner. No negative comments in the media.
3. Ensure that all facility rules and regulations are followed by the players, coaches, and spectators, respecting at all times the property of others.
4. Assist the game officials in maintaining control of spectators during the games when necessary.
5. Respect the coaches and players of the opposing team and demonstrate appropriate gestures of sportsmanship during the play of the game and at its conclusion. Be humble and generous in victory. Be proud and courteous in defeat. Teach each player, especially through personal example, to be humble and generous in victory and proud and courteous in defeat.
6. Maintain emotional and physical control, avoiding the use of abusive language or profanity, humiliating remarks, gestures of ill temper, and physical assault upon another individual. Coaches should refrain from making comments from the bench during an opponent's free kicks or throw-ins.
7. Instruct team support personnel (e.g. assistant coaches, managers, scorebook keepers, and timekeepers) in their responsibilities in accordance with established rules and procedures.
8. Realize, accept and practice the principle that a team's reputation is built not only on its playing ability, but also on its sportsmanship, courtesy and conduct.
