"Any competitor must be a bona fide student in the member school district represented and is considered to be the school team or part of such team. Compliance with all NYSPHSAA regulations is required. Participation as an individual competitor counts toward the maximum number of contests permitted and meets the requirements of the Representation Standard".

WARRANT TO THE STATE OF THE STA



- All safety related equipment required for competition should be worn in all "practice sessions".

- Jewelry should NOT be worn in practice

I believe the following list should be taken back to the leagues and also forwarded to the Section IX Sports Chairperson to develop procedures relating to potential savings.

- A. Section IX Tournament contests up to but not including the Section IX Finals. The officials would be selected and assigned from their home board.
- B. Tennis Boys and Girls Reduce the number of qualifiers to the tournament.
- C. Soccer Boys and Girls, Volleyball, Field Hockey, Basketball Boys and Girls, Baseball, Softball and Lacrosse Boys and Girls. Increase the percentage from .500 to .600 in order to qualify for the tournament.
- D. Boys and Girls Swimming: Reduce the entries into the Section IX Championship.
- E. Boys and Girls Golf: Reduce the entries into the Section IX Championship.
- F. Wrestling Establish entry requirements to compete in the Section IX Tournament. Section IX Duals should not be an Open Tournament.
- G. Winter Track Reduce the entries into the Class A/B meets.

These items to be discussed should generate a list of discussion and hopefully produce new ideas on potential savings in athletics.

#### APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION INTO SECTION IX

The Superintendent of a school seeking admission to the section must apply to the Secretary of the section in writing by **November 30th** for admission September 1 of the next year. The secretary will present the name of the school to the Athletic Council for its decision on acceptance or rejection, which will be a 2/3 vote. Application by a school to join or to withdraw from a league within Section IX (full or partial membership) must be submitted in writing by November 30th of the year before the implementation date, to the Section IX Athletic Council with copies of the application simultaneously forwarded to the leagues affected. It is acknowledged that the section has the authority to assign league affiliation to a school, by sport, but that such an action will be taken only after due process hearings including all leagues involved.
